Frank Megens should be congratulated in organizing this show where competitors submitted one picture for each entry for consideration by the judges. There can only be thanks for the hundreds of Welsh enthusiasts who submitted pictures in the various classes including South Africa – this made it a truly International field. Naturally, it was difficult to judge only on pictures which may not always be showing off the pony or cob in the most favourable light but the judges gave of their best. There were 490 Section A entered, 366 Section B, 266 Section C, 435 Section D, 324 Partbred in the In-Hand alone – truly remarkable. Congratulations to the Supreme Champion, Talponciau Cameo and the Reserve Supreme, Amilas Mendelssohn FR with the second reserve being Shamrocklake Silk Hortensia.

Regrettably some of the pictures were of such low quality that they were not suitable for printing in the Journal. It would help if in future entrants submitted pictures which showed off their ponies/cobs to their advantage and a quality which could be printed. Many of the relevant prizewinners for South Africa are reflected at the end of this article. If the photo you submitted was one of the prizewinners and is not featured later, the reason can only be that it was not of the required quality.

Welsh Mountain Pony Section A In-Hand

In total we had 490 entries with an amazing 88 foals alone! Judge Jo Sheil of the Dukeshill Stud had this to say: Wow, what a task. So big in fact I had to enlist the help of Kathy Sheil...thank you. So many photos, so many lovely ponies. And much more difficult to judge than a live show as a photo only gives a snapshot, no going back for a second look, and of course could not pick up faults I would ordinarily pick out. The quality of the photo was a huge factor, the wrong angle made it difficult to assess the pony even if it was an attractive picture, a shadow in the wrong place making a front look short or quarters weak. So many ponies I know I really like did not figure high in the results as the photo didn't do them justice, so just because your pony didn't place in this does not mean I would not like it in a real life show! Also if a pony figured high in one class I took it out of the placings in other classes to give all a chance, but left the highest placing. The winners are all very worthy, lovely ponies with photos showing them to best advantage. Well done everyone and thank you for your support from all over the world. A truly international show!!
